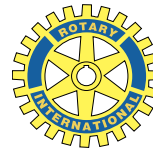
Rotary Leadership Institute January 27th In Clearwater

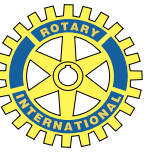

Paul Slosberg – “Mr. Rotary Foundation” Salutes Our Club

Dunedin and Dunedin North are the two strongest supporters in District 6950 of The Rotary Foundation. Paul believes that we are lucky to live in the U.S. and have an obligations to help less fortunate people. Paul noted that if you live in a house without a dirt floor you are in the wealthiest 50% of the world population. If you have one bedroom with one window, you are in the top 20% of the wealthiest in the world. If you have a family car, microwave and fridge, you are in the top 1% of the wealthiest people in the world! There are many people in need.

Paul stated that 25% of the Paul Harris Society in District 6950 are from our Rotary Club.

The Rotary Foundation Programs started in 1946 with the Ambassadorial Scholarships which is one of largest scholarship programs in the U.S. It is larger than Rhodes and Fulbright combined and is the largest privately funded scholarship program. In 1978 The RI Foundation expanded into Health, Hunger and Humanities which became Polio Plus. Between 1985 and 1988 Rotarians raised over \$600 million to eradicate Polio. Today Polio has been eliminated from most of the world. All new polio cases are limited to four countries and Rotary is working to completely eliminate Polio from the world.
