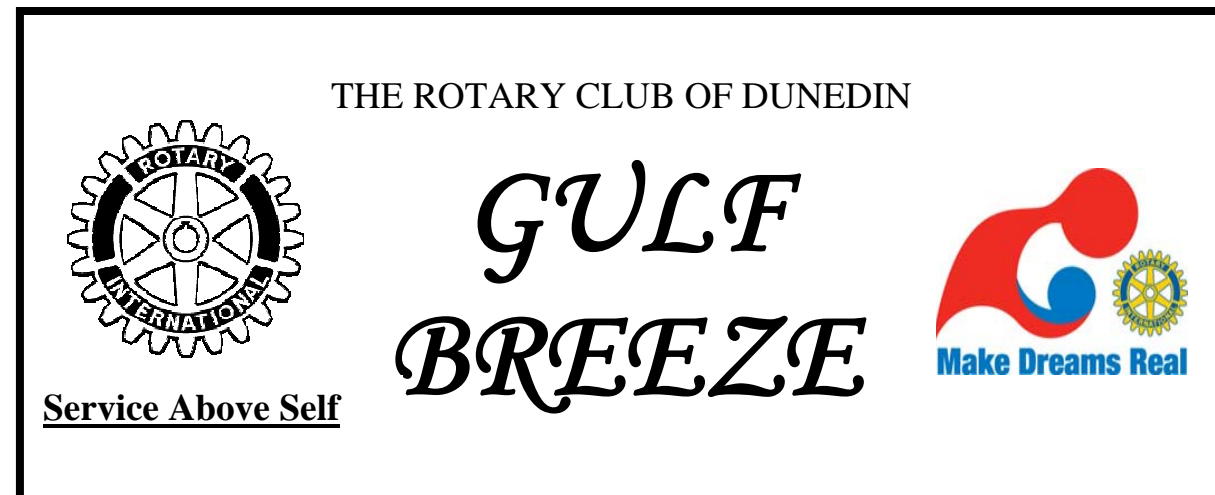

Program - Janet Cardarelli - Dress for Success of Tampa Bay



Janet spoke of her volunteer involvement with Dress for Success (Suits to Self Sufficiency) that led to her employment with this 501 (c) (3) organization based in Tampa with this mission: to promote the economic independence of disadvantaged women by providing professional attire, a network of support and the career development tools to help women thrive in work and in life. The organization was founded in New York

in 1997 and has assisted more than 450,000 women around the world. Pat Ellington of Tampa founded the first Dress for Success in our area around 10 years ago. Through this program DFSTB provides complete interview appropriate attire to women who are referred through community partner agencies, such as churches and neighborhood centers. Clients are also assisted with resume writing, cover letters, and the interview process. Once they become clients, a volunteer personal shopper assists them with finding the proper attire that complements their personality and ensures the interview attire is appropriate. DFSTB is serving about 1,000 women a year with clothing, as well as counseling on job retention after they are employed. Clients who are employed network at monthly meetings with speakers on topics important to personal and professional development. Janet stressed, “We don’t just give them a suit and send them on their way.”

Donations of suits and accessories are accepted. All donations should be in excellent, ready-to-wear condition (laundered and ironed or dry-cleaned and pressed. Items needed are: skirt or pant suits, blouses, blazers and jackets, pants and skirts, new or nearly new dress shoes, scarves, handbags and new panty hose. Dress for Success will pick up donations.
