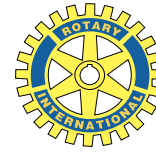

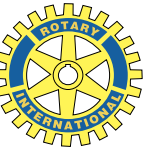

Christine Warwick from The Haven, August 1st Speaker



The Haven has been helping people for 25 years and is one of four components of Religious Community Services or RCS. The Haven is a non-denominational organization that provides safety, support and education to anyone impacted by domestic violence and advocates for social change to end the violence.

According to Christine, domestic violence is an epidemic. One out of four

kids live in a home with domestic violence and one in four women will be a victim of domestic violence sometime in their life. Approximately 5% of the people who seek help from the Haven are men. The Haven provides help and housing to between 500 and 600 women and children every year.

The Haven is always looking for volunteers and there are several ways to help. The Outreach program gets volunteers to speak to groups in the community and offers trainings to help doctors, nurses, teachers and law enforcement recognize the signs of abuse and how to help. Outreach also offers help to men, women and children by educating and informing victims of the court process and their legal rights. To make sure that the Outreach volunteers are trained and prepared the Haven requires volunteers to complete a 24 hour class. The Haven receives funding from 19 sources including federal, state, and local governments, congregations and predominately through individuals.
