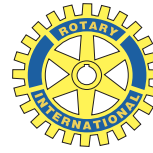

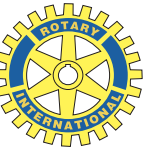

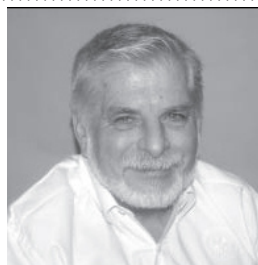
**HAPPY BUCKS**

**Assistant District Governor Speaks on Rotary Missions**



Assistant District Governor John Gallant

Last week we welcomed Assistant District Governor John Gallant as our speaker. John spoke to us about our service efforts both globally and locally. John said that he is always impressed with the commitment Rotarians make to serve others.

For John, his local efforts came easily as it was easy to be aware of local

people or groups that needed assistance. His international efforts came about more recently when he made a trip to Peru, his first trip back in 30 years. While in Peru, John witnessed the deplorable conditions that impoverished families are living with every day. There was little food available so most of the people were malnourished. Fresh water was hardly available and housing was more makeshift than a sturdy structure.

In the past few years John's Club has been organizing service trips to Huanuco, Peru where they devote their efforts to helping establish sys-

tems to supply fresh water, build better housing, provide medical and dental services and create an agriculture mission to help provide food to the people and to teach the people how to provide food for themselves. Thanks to the efforts of John's club and several others more than 600 families who were without fresh water just a few years ago are now beginning to enjoy this basic necessity.

Recent efforts in Peru include a 3 story hospital at the orphanage. The project is under construction and funds are still being raised to complete the 3rd floor. The first floor will serve as a dental clinic and will provide care to hundreds of Peruvian children. Past projects at the orphanage have already brought about positive changes for the children liv-

ing there. As recently as 2004 there were 239 children at the orphanage living in less than adequate housing and without fresh water. Today there are more than 400 children and all of them enjoy homes with real walls and fresh water to drink.

Medical services are also in short supply in Peru. Each year John's Club assists in the effort to help 40 children with cleft pallets receive the surgery they need to correct this facial birth defect.

John said that he and his value have really grown as a result of their service trips to Peru and he encourages all of us both in our club and individual efforts to reach out locally and globally.
