#### Speaker: Gene Beil, Representative to the Rotary Council on Legislation

Gene Beil from the Hudson Rotary Club, Past District Governor and recipient of citation from Rotary International who also has 25 years of perfect attendance. Gene attended the Rotary Council on Legislation held in Chicago in April. He was one of 530 district representatives from around the world. The meeting is held every 3 years to make changes to the Rotary Constitution and by-laws. Clubs may nominate amendments to the Rotary Manual to be considered by the council. Delegates were able to hear in their own language as 219 pieces of legislation were presented, discussed and voted upon. Some of the issues were: redefinition of club officers to include the immediate past president (passed); meetings may be held less than once a week (failed); Making e clubs a permanent part of Rotary (passed); Preclude sexual discrimination in Rotary membership (passed); any past Rotary officer should be entitled to travel first class (passed, even though a rejection would have saved Rotary \$1million. Rejected resolutions included: a proposal that districts hold conference every 2 years; that RI no longer send reps to district conferences; extend district governorships to 2 years. Five avenues of service now include New Generations. The rule of 85 allows for members who are at least 65 years of age and have years of service added to their age for a sum total of 85 to become emeritus. The makeup of the attendees (all past district governors) to the conference was 80% male and 20% female.
